Nashville-based Modern Red SchoolHouse has awarded Superintendent Beverly Hall the Distinguished Service Award.

The award is given to teachers, administrators and other practitioners in education who have made a significant contribution to improving student outcomes and institutional practices in America's schools.

The Modern Red SchoolHouse Institute is a nonprofit organization that helps schools strengthen teaching and learning and measure their progress against rigorous standards.

The organization was founded in 1991 by the Hudson Institute and was among the first "break the mold" school improvement models selected by the U.S. Department of Education and the New American Schools Development Corp. to improve public education nationwide.

Today, the school improvement organization collaborates with more than 100 school districts in 30 states to break down barriers that hinder student success.
